- Show Listings are separated by STATE, then sorted by DATE within that State's section.
- If you work in more than one state, look in the Shows At a Glance section in the back where all events are sorted by DATE, with application deadlines.

This star indicates that this is either a new show since last issue or an event with updated information from a previous issue.

Watch this spot. We are developing a Show Locator Code to help you find where the shows are located.

BOUTIQUES: These are usually temporary consignment situations that operate as a show. They may be juried, - and sales are consummated for you. You don't need to be present. On acceptance, you deliver your work, and they sell it for you. You pay a commission or a fee plus commission. When the event is over, you pick up the remainder of your stock, or have it shipped to you, and you receive payment, less commission. They collect sales tax and send it in for you.

WHOLESALE SHOWS: Customers who attend are from businesses. For entry they must present several forms of business ID, possibly invoices, business cards, a yellow page ad, etc. They are from stores, galleries, shops, etc. and pay a wholesale price, then resell the product.

In this issue we publish all the information we have to date, - up to a year in advance. Detailed descriptions of each event, including eligibility requirements, contact information, even email address and websites when available.

Look at the ★ STARS! ★ They indicate events published for the first time since the last issue. **Next issue: to be mailed on/about 9/15.**

Advertising on a Tight Budget

Advertising means brand-recognition, new sales and repeat customers

Advertising makes the difference between floundering in red ink and getting decent returns, especially for a micro-business. I hear complaints all the time that *there's not enough money for advertising, that the operating budget is too tight, etc.* Turn some of the creativity you use to make and display your product to brand recognition, getting the word out in your community, and bringing in repeat orders.

Brand Recognition

What is your business name? It's amazing how many people choose strange and clunky names for their business. You can create something descriptive, unique or even whimsical, but please don't pull in the word *crafty*! It has negative connotations. *Crafty* means skilled in or marked by underhandedness, deviousness, or deception. Great names I found, and someone already thought of: *Terra Firma Irma* (semi-precious stone jewelry), *The Portrait Wiz*, *Injeanious*, *Phenomenal Fudge*, *Sew It Is*.

Many people use their names as in *Glenda Sweet*, *Silversmith*, or *Sweet Silver*. If you have a logo, it should remind people of your product. When customers attend a fair or craft show, they collect information from exhibitors whose products they like. They take home a handful of fliers and business cards and a few days later they haven't a clue who sells what. That's why your information should relate to your distinctive product and remind them *who you are*, and *what your product is*.

Getting the Word Out And Bringing in Repeat Orders

Business cards can be as inexpensive as \$30/1,000. If you have a website and email address, make sure it is listed along with your phone number. Put one in every bag for your customer. Many people tack business cards and small fliers on the refrigerator as a reminder and an easy way to keep track of contact information.

Fliers are even less expensive. Create tiny ones that fit 8 on a page. Microsoft Publisher is just one software program that makes making mini-fliers simple. If you have only a hundred sheets run off, 6 or 8 to the page, your yield is 600-800 mini-fliers. (Always use pastel paper, white paper is boring!) Set these out on your table as *pick-ups* for people who are not yet ready to buy, but are interested in your product. Put them

in the bag with each purchase.

Put your next few shows, with *dates*, *show name and location* on the fliers. Then put your contact information, website, email address, etc. This may bring a few people to your next shows and is an effective way to advertise.

One benefit of using mini-fliers is that you print only a few hundred at a time, so you can update your show schedule every few weeks when you use them up.

Stickers with your business name, phone number, email address and website if you have one, should be on every product you sell. When they run out of product,

or give it away, the recipient will know how to order more. If your product is gift-boxed, put the sticker on the bottom of the box. If it's a garment, sew a cloth tag inside a seam. You want repeat business? This is a small task indeed for future orders. Remember, *it is easier to sell to a customer who knows your product than to convince a complete stranger to buy your product.*

Put stickers on the back of your framed photos, artwork, the bottom of table lamps, paperweights, sculpture, toys, puzzles, etc. These are sold as return address labels in ads in the Sunday papers. They are usually sold in a roll of 500 or 1,000 for only a few dollars. Count spaces to make sure you can get all the information on your labels that you want, (name or business name, phone number, website or email address). They

are usually available in white, silver, gold or clear. Use the font that is the most legible, - usually arial, *not the fancy one that looks like calligraphy*. They are also available in clear labels, which are particularly nice on the bottom of jewelry boxes.

You may not want to have *your home address* listed on any of the above literature. If you have a post office box, it will suffice; if not, just your phone number will do.

One day a customer told me he drove up and down Hollow road on a Sunday morning looking for our house so his wife could buy some more big stoneware bowls (during my clay exploration.) I was absolutely horrified. We lived back in the woods so it was no surprise that he couldn't find us, - but a Sunday morning unexpected visit was the last thing I wanted.

I had no sales room. I worked downstairs in the basement with boxes of clay stacked eye-high in a corner, jugs of glaze, a small wheel, three kilns and loads of mess! God forbid a customer walks through and trips on an extension cord or bangs her head on Lou's radial arm saw or my press! *If you don't want surprise visits, leave your home address out of your contact information!*

Hang tags: These can be tied on with narrow ribbon, string, hemp, etc., or enclosed in the box, or tucked in the bag with the product. Use for special care instructions or varied-use ideas and *on the back*,

Signage at your booth. Make it outstanding. It can be elegant and refined, or a restrained 14" x 20" framed sign with your name or business name, and your product name or logo, - as in Betty Chypre, Metal smith. My logo was of specialty hammers and repeated on my business cards, fliers, hang-tags, etc.

Your sign can be whimsical, if it fits in with your booth and product. I remember a guild member who had a large black and white plywood cow over her booth, with the words "*Udder Confusion*." Nobody passed without a giggle or a smile, and it stopped many people in their tracks. Customers will walk the show looking for your sign.

Postcards are inexpensive advertising. Your customer knows your work, so it's easier to resell more product, (as long as you continue to bring new ideas and designs into your line)

Collect names and addresses put them in your database from their checks, credit cards, or from your Sign-Up book. Your book should be presented prominently on your display with a notice, *Please sign up to receive notification of future shows*. Ask for names and addresses.

Some people collect just email addresses and send out emails. Considering spam blocks and the fact that recipients

may not recognize your email address before they blip it away, *it is more than worth the investment to send out postcards.*

You can make your own using lightweight cover stock (check your printer manual for the heaviest weight it will take). You can also print it on plain paper and take it to a copy shop for them to print on pastel colored cover stock. Make use of the left side of the postcard for an extra message, graphic of one of your more recognizable pieces, and use the back for show information, - either a list of several shows, or the next one you are doing. Sort addresses according to zip code, and send out postcards to customers up to 30 or 40 minutes away from the next show location. This will usually keep your mailing down to less than 100. If someone has not bought from you in three years, - delete the record.

Show Information: I have seen fliers that gave the date, the name of the show and the city, *forgetting to give a street location*. Many people won't make the effort to find out where McComb's Jr. H.S. is, so you will lose an attendee right there. Put as much information as you can on the card, after all, you want them to *find you*. If you know your space number, put that down, as well as the hours, and the admission fee.

If there is an admission fee, - use reimbursement as an incentive to bring

We get letters, and emails:
They usually start out,

Dear Betty:



I'm a RESELLER, *So what?*

I consider myself a good and honorable person. So: *why am I getting the brush-off and dirty looks from crafters?* We are each trying to earn money in our own way.

I had an experience at an OPEN fair recently, where I was set up with many other commercial vendors, and some craftsmen, and I was approached by someone and asked for a small favor. I recognized this person as someone who writes often to a trade publication belittling resellers who sell even at open events. I am a polite man so I didn't speak my mind, but you can probably imagine what I was thinking.

Open events are OPEN to anyone willing to pay the price for the space. I honor eligibility guidelines at juried shows. I don't sell my products there.

I understand how craftsmen feel when someone misrepresents his wares as hand-made and tries to sell them at juried shows, or shows that specify 'hand-made by vendor only'. I am not that person. Most vendors are not that person. *So why am I accorded this disrespect?*

Think about it: *Gift shops, accessories stores, boutiques, galleries, etc. are resellers.*

I take the products I buy for resale and present them to the public on the road instead of renting a fixed-place brick-and-mortar space to sell, - *that is the only difference between them and me.* When you are thirsty at a show and buy a soda, a bottle of water, a hot-dog, - you are buying from a reseller. Resellers are a hard-working part of the community. Not everyone has the talent or the desire to make a saleable product from start to finish. When people buy from me, *it's because I have something they want.* If you are at an open show and can't compete with my product - *you are at the wrong show!* *Maybe you also have the wrong product.*

Being treated like a third-class citizen ticks me off. Don't criticize my products when they are sold at OPEN shows. They belong there, and the promoters were glad to rent me space and take my money. If this makes you unhappy, maybe you shouldn't sell *your* work there. Maybe you should spend a little more time and effort to find a juried show to sell your work, where you'll be surrounded by like products.

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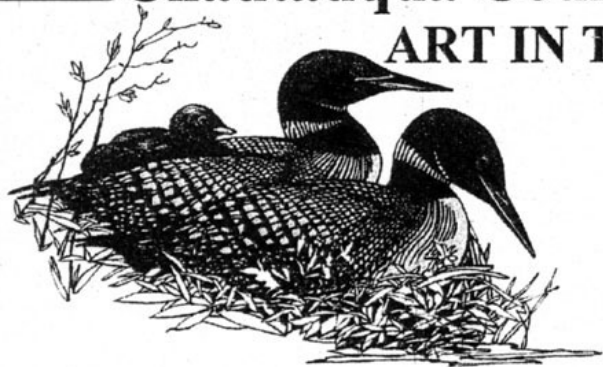

Don't Get WRINKLED BURNED & TICKED

Wrinkles are unsightly. A wrinkled table cover sabotages your display. That is why I always recommend double-knit polyester fabric for table covers. Your product display is your presentation to the public. I have seen all kinds of table-covers, including a lovely lace tablecloth, backed by a solid color fabric. This would have been acceptable for many large products, (ceramic vases, dolls, etc) but when tiny jewelry pieces are laid on lace, the pattern in the lace makes earrings and delicate necklaces all but invisible. *Invisible pieces don't sell.* Simple!

More about wrinkles: *the personal kind.* Many of you have seen me at shows for the past 20 years or so, - and if you think back, I'm the one with a big smile and a wide-brim white canvas hat. I bought that hat from *Hot-Hatters* of Boulder, CO, - about 17 years ago at the Gilroy Garlic Festival. Before that I wore a wide-brim straw hat, a brown felt wide-brimmed hat, and sometimes a wide-brim denim hat. They all have *at least* 3 1/2-inch brims, - the brim on my favorite white hat is 4" wide.

I'm sure by now you're wondering "What's with this hat-thing? What is on her mind?" Wrinkles, my friend, - old-age wrinkles are NOT from old age, they are from the sun and from smoking, which makes capillaries lose their ability to expand/contract. I don't have much to say about smoking. - Signs in public places and on cigarette packs say it all, - but the sun: *the sun and I are old adversaries.*

I suffered many sun burns on my back and arms as a child, hanging over the edge

of the dock catching tadpoles and little fishes. Summer days at Orchard beach were fun, and we even sunned ourselves on the roof of our apartment house to get a nice *healthy* tan. *Who knew then about skin cancer and wrinkles?*

Somewhere along in my late 20's or early 30's I read about sun-aged skin, and skin cancers. I put hats on my kids, and I have worn a hat outdoors ever since. My face is unwrinkled, - at 67. Imagine that! People tell me I look in my 50's.

Lest you think it's a genetic anomaly, let me say that my face has been protected all these years, *but I totally forgot my arms.* I've worked in the garden, helped side the house, painted trim, etc. year after year, in sleeveless shirts and forgot to protect my arms. My wrinkled hands and arms belong to an old lady. The only difference between wrinkled skin and smooth skin is sun exposure. The best thing I can say about wrinkled skin is that it shows *character*. My arms don't need any *more* character!

Oh, by the way, I paid dearly for my before-age 30 sun exposure. About 6 years ago I had a basal-cell carcinoma cut out of my upper lip, and skin grafted in its place.

As my friend Denise was growing up, her grandmother told her the sun was poison. *She always wears a hat,* - and looks 20 years younger than her chronological age.

According to dermatologists, even a *light tan* makes major changes to skin cells. *Baseball hats don't protect very much of you at all.* They shade part of your face but leave your ears and back of your neck exposed. There are many wide-brim hats that look hot on men. So go out and get yourself a little corner on the fountain of youth, - it's called a "*hat*." Once you start trying them on, you'll find sev-

eral that express your personality to a 'T' and are fun to wear. It's just a matter of making a choice!

By the way: Sunscreen and sunglasses are also good investments in comfort and long-term health.

Ticked in New York State, CT, NJ, PA, - and the mid-west, too!

Tourism councils and Chambers of Commerce won't tell you about deer ticks when you stop for a map. They won't say "*Welcome to New York State, - watch out for ticks!*" In the past 10 years deer ticks have spread like wildfire across the north-east. Carried by deer and mice, (and squirrels, birds, etc.) they infest brush and high grass. Many of them carry borrelia, a spirochete that causes Lyme disease, and also erlichiosis and babesiosis, two other tick-borne diseases. Dutchess county NY is one of the hot-spots of the nation; governor Potaki's office won't warn you about ticks, but you read it here.

Some of Lyme disease's symptoms: short-term memory loss, numbness, usually beginning in the feet and/or hands, confusion, and in children it often manifests as Bell's palsy, affecting one side of the face.

Not everyone gets the typical bull's eye rash. Sometimes symptoms make you feel as if you're coming down with the flu. If ignored, symptoms escalate and the spirochete travels up the spine and affects the central nervous system.

Early in the year, in the nymph state, ticks can be as small as the dot over an 'i'. As they reach adult size, they are large enough to be noticed.

Outdoor shows have been traditionally profitable venues for many exhibitors. Continue to enjoy these events, but take precau-

tions:

- Stay away from brush, deep grass, and overhanging branches.

- Wear light-colored clothing so it's easier to see ticks on the fabric.

- Spray insect repellent with deet on your clothes and shoes, - *not on your skin*.

- If you find a tick, it will probably be nestled where your skin folds over; they like warm places. Remove it carefully by slowly lifting it off the skin with a tick remover or tweezers (taking care not to squeeze the insect or it will inject more fluid into your flesh). Do NOT use lighter fluid or bury it in Vaseline.

If a tick has been attached for 24 hours or more, see a doctor. Call ahead to find out if they want you to bring in the tick.

Your doctor may prescribe a Western Blot test (considered the more reliable test for borellia by medical professionals.) Antibiotics (doxycycline) is the treatment of choice.



Here's what deer ticks look like from nymph stage to large, engorged adult female. My husband Lou had Lyme disease in the 90's, before the symptoms were recognized. A few simple precautions will prevent your getting wrinkled, burned or ticked.

Have fun this summer and may all your shows be profitable.

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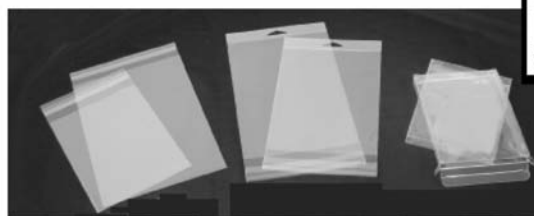
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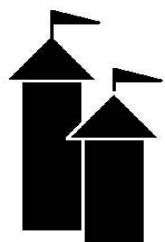

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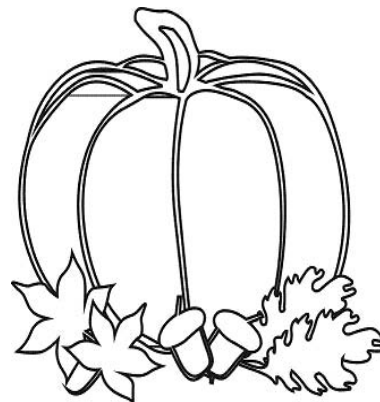
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Time to Change Your Business Structure?

Maybe when you first started out in business you didn't look beyond setting up a checking account and getting a sales tax certificate. Most likely you set up the business as a sole proprietorship, and you had no reason to think about doing it any other way.

Now your business has grown a bit, and you see income potential. Of course that usually means higher taxes too, - but not always. As a self-employed business owner, you can shelter part of your income in an IRA, a SIMPLE IRA, or a SEP IRA. You can also change your business structure to your advantage.

You can establish a SEP-IRA if you:

- Are a sole proprietor, in a partnership, or a business owner (of either an unincorporated or incorporated business, including Subchapter S corporations);
- Earn self-employed income by providing a service, either full-time or part-time, even if you are already covered by a retirement plan at your full-time job.

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The nice thing about sheltering income by deferring taxes into a retirement account is that it can grow in a money market account or in stocks without being taxed until you withdraw it on retirement. That gives it a lot of growing power.

If you are married, and your spouse earns enough to pay maximum social security tax, consider putting the business in your spouse's name and avoid paying social security tax on the business income.

If liability is a major concern, consider incorporating your business into a sub-chapter S corporation. Business assets would have to be transferred into the corporation, but your personal assets would usually be safe from lawsuits. This is similar to a regular C corporation except for the tax structure. A sub chapter S corporation is taxed just like a sole proprietorship. Profit and loss flow straight through without complications to the shareholders' individual tax returns, and offers liability protections inherent to a corporation.

There is an extensive set of rules and by-laws that must be followed to conform to IRS guidelines. Unfortunately, about a half-dozen states levy *corporate income tax*

on S Corporations, so check with your tax advisor carefully to make sure your state is not one of these.

A general partnership is a common way for people to share skills or contribute capital. Gains and losses in a general partnership flow directly through to individual partners' personal tax returns and the business usually is not taxed as a separate entity.

I consider a **partnership** a risky way of doing business, because each partner is liable for debts and judgments against the business. That means your bank account, car, even your home could be seized by creditors. Best friends can become enemies!

This is not a Pie-in-the-Sky concept. This is reality. It happened to me years ago. My partner was pocketing cash and using the company checking account to pay personal bills for auto repair, utilities, and even grocery-shopping. When the family went on vacation I picked up the mail. I had a handful of letters from several collection agencies.

With a feeling of dread I went to the local bank. I was advised to close the checking account, seize the merchandise, and ask all our creditors for an accounting. It took 7 months and the services of a CPA to try to square things away.

Lots of cash disappeared without a trace. I could prove fraudulent activity with the cancelled checks, but I chose not to take legal action. It was a frightening experience. I warn against the vulnerabilities of a regular partnership every time I speak to home-based business people about the forms of business ownership.

At that time I promised myself that the only partnership I would ever enter would be with my husband, - and so it has turned out.

A limited liability partnership (L.L.P.) allows partners to decrease their personal liability while they give up day-to-day active management of the business. There must be at least one general partner.

Limited partnerships are more complex than general partnerships, and the laws vary state to state so they often take more time and legal advice to set up.

Because of legal protections inherent in LLP's, you can lose no more than your business investment, *unlike a general part-*

your customer to the show! Offer a refund of the admission fee with a sale of \$30 or more, or \$50 or more, - or a percentage off sales of that amount.

Your website: It's more than a sales venue. It's publicity and a way to get reorders. Even if they don't order through your website, they may check your schedule and show up in person. Put your website on every piece of paper, every sticker, every flier, business card, etc. that you can. If

there is room, also put the statement "See my website for my show schedule" Make sure your website's show schedule page is current and up to date.

Use as many of the above suggestions as possible, but remember that you won't see results immediately. Like a snowball that rolls downhill, it will start small, and grow.

Remember, you can never be too rich, too skinny, or have too much adver-

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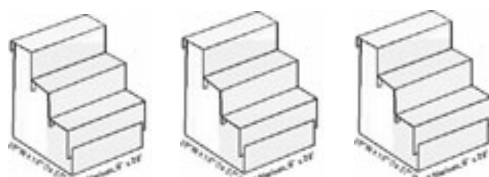

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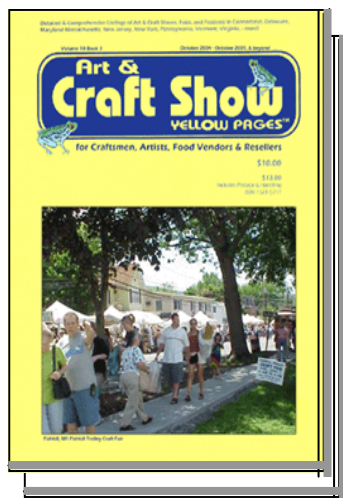
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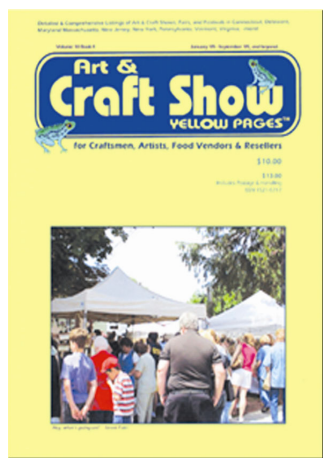
